

> KB2HQS Stumbles Onto the Airwaves With First QSO

[Much to The Probable Chagrin of N5OBF]

Webster, NY - The long-awaited and historical occasion of KB2HQS' very first QSO in the history of the human race [records were extensively searched for verification] occurred here on Wednesday, May 3, 1989. Here's what KB2HQS had to say through a fog of euphoria, enthusiasm and the usual lack of connection.

"I waited about 6 years [subjective time], or maybe it was only 5 weeks [real time] for my novice license to get to me. The FCC sent it by yak mail. who had shown me how to use the club receiver. Was there anything I had to know that he hadn't shown me? Well yes, there's the little matter of tuning the transmitter [oh, details, you think 22nd century historians are going to include that?]. OK, KE2LU agreed to meet me at high noon, local, the next day.

"Another 6 years of waiting, but the next day did roll around, as next days are inclined to do in the fruition of time, and....there we are at last: KB2HQS, ink still wet on the license, KE2LU, long-suffering as usual, and one authentic club rig.

"Do you want to try CW or voice?' asks KE2LU.

"Oh, CW of course,' answers KB2HQS the jock, who never does anything by halves.

"I'm sorry to report that I don't remember a single thing KE2LU showed me about the transmitter because I was so d-d excited about the whole thing -- although I'm sure that was concealed by my usual air of suave cool and detached sophistication, oh sure...

"Anyways, there isn't much on 10 meters, so we switch to 15. Immediately, we hear somebody tune up and send a QRL. Just after that, he sends his CQ.

and I pounce on the poor sucker before he knows what's going on [everybody has to have a first victim]. He is N5OBF. It's a good thing KE2LU is there to steady me down. I manage to get N5OBF's attention, send my call sign funny at first [so bad he had to QRZ]. So I repeat - funny again...how am I doing so far?

"A short pause, then back comes 'TNX FER CALL. NM HR ES BRIAN. HW CPY K2HQS [sic--still ain't got my own call sign down] DE N5OBF KN'

"'Send your call sign again,' says KE2LU, 'and your QTH again. And send this.' And he pushes a piece of paper at me that says THIS IS MY FIRST QSO.

"Having that helps a great deal. Out goes my call - better this time, QTH and THIS IS MY FIRST QSO. This time I do better, apparently, because back comes KB2HQS DE N5OBF RR CPY ALL BUT QTH--CONGRATS ON FIRST QSO. More excitement on KB2HQS' part, she's becoming more coherent. To make a long story short [you can read about it in more detail in my autobiography], Brian is calling from Biloxi, Mississippi [how about that?!].

"'Ask if he's in the call book,' suggests KE2LU.

"'What call book?' says KB2HQS, getting vague on everything but this QSO.

"No, answers N5OBF, but he will QSL my first QSO if I send my address.

"I'm happy to report that I steady down enough to get my address through the first time. Again I have help, because KE2LU has brought along a spectacular [OK, modestly spectacular, spectacular to me] QSL card for me, complete with sailboat [the subject closest to my heart]. After a slight discussion on how to spell Wixsom [Wixom or Wixsom, KE2LU almost has me convinced for a minute there], N5OBF comes back MUST QRT ES GO BK TO WORK. GOOD LUCK ES WELCOME TO HAM--BEST 73 SHANNON.

"Want to send hugs and kisses, because he probably doesn't know you're female,' says KE2LU. Oh yes, hugs and kisses is exactly what I feel like sending right now. Then send 73 ES 88."

"73 ES 88 it is, then a signoff.

"I did it!' says KB2HQS.

"The job isn't over till the paperwork is done.' KE2LU grins and hands me the log.

"So not having any gold pen, I record my very first QSO in the XARC logbook in

plain and modest pencil. And there it remains, for God and everybody to see.

"And there you have it, sports fans. If KB2HQS can do it, so can you. I plan to inflict myself on the amateur bands as often as I can. Do you know what euphoria is? Do you remember your first QSO?

"I"ll never forget mine.

Many, many thanks to KE2LU and N50BF."

And that's the way it was with KB2HQS on Wednesday, May 3, 1989.
