



Field Day Alert!

This months meeting will be the final planning session for this years Field Day activities. Please attend if possible.

Karz's Korner-

What a month! In case you haven't heard, for the first time in club history, we have a first class HF station. We also have a new two meter repeater up and running, and we may be about to acquire a Yaseu 620B 6 meter CW/SSB/AM transceiver. In addition, experiments by Barry Rickett, N2EZS, with an AEA Isopole antenna suggest that our problems with the 440 machine at the square may be nearing resolution. Finally, Field Day is only 10 days away. It just doesn't get any better than this!

Those of you at the last meeting witnessed a successful link up with Don Moberly, WA6LFC, at the Emergency Communications Center for the El Segundo Disaster Preparedness Program. Also present at Don's end was Tom Goralski who is Manager of Security/Disaster Preparedness there. Tom was impressed with our QSO, but the shortcomings of our ancient HW-101 were also evident (particularly the lack of Receiver Increment Tuning or RIT). Don and Tom reviewed the disaster preparedness budget and equipment status in El Segundo against their requirement to be able to link up with us in an emergency and decided to ship us BOTH a Kenwood TS-140 transceiver and an Ameritron 600 watt linear amplifier.

Several club members were present at noon on June 7 when we tried out the 140 with another successful contact with Don in El Segundo, this time with no "creeping" down the band from lack of an RIT. We'll be trying out the amplifier in a few weeks once we've had time to hook up the control and ALC circuits. We plan to test the reliability of the link to El Segundo at least monthly, coinciding for the time being

with our regular club meetings. Don and I have also developed and a preliminary protocol of calling frequencies, times, and procedures so we can make contact as quickly as possible after any disaster. It is now incumbent on us to bring other Xerox locations into the "net" and to establish a liaison with the RACES (emergency communications) organization here in Monroe County. I have already spoken with Bob Lis who manages security here in Webster, and I will be keeping him updated on our capabilities.

The TS-140 is an ideal club rig because it is "state of the art" while still being easy to operate. Tom has encouraged us to all to use and enjoy it so that we can have as large a pool of experienced operator on the rig as possible should the need arise. Our club is most grateful to Don and Tom for supplying us with equipment we would not otherwise have been able to afford. Having the gear at our station is good for the El Segundo Disaster Preparedness Program, good for Xerox, and certainly good for our club.

I should also mention that the day the equipment arrived here (June 6) happens to be my Birthday.....nice gift!!

A second gift that day was news from John Wright, KE2MK, that the 2 meter repeater is on the air from Building 128. You can see the antenna looming over the east entrance to the building. Its input is 144.69 Mhz and its output is on 145.290. I understand people have made it into the machine from as far away as the airport. Coverage will be even better once we relocate it to the top of Xerox Square. Nice going John. You've put a lot of hard work into the repeater, and its finally paid off.

We're trying to get a count of how many people to expect for Field Day June 23 and 24. If you plan to participate (and who wouldn't!) drop me an electronic mail note (KARZ:WBST311), call me at X29530, or send me a note by regular mail (311-01C). I hope you've all been boning up on your CW (remember, CW contacts count double).

One post script on my daughter Lisa KB2JQQ who along with her pal Bonnie, KB2JQP worked their first public service event (the 10K "Human Race" at the JCC) last Sunday. You will recall that Lisa worked Norfolk Island while I did not. Well, we both worked Botswanna and both sent out QSL cards (in the same envelope no less). Guess which one of us received a QSL card back. That's right. Not me. Must have been something I said.

There's still lots to catch up on including what happened to the JCC TS-440, the hamfest, the QSL card contest, our application to become a special service club, and the special events station, but we'll save that for next month. We'll also have another Field Day behind us by then.
