

Disaster at Sea

In case you haven't heard, Shannon (WV2J) and her husband's boat, the Stormy Weather, ran into some of the ame this past Monday and rolled in 25 foot seas. The boat righted itself with Shannon (who was not wearing a safety

harness) and Ron fortunately still on board after 10 to 15 terrifying seconds submerged. However, the boat was apparently damaged and began to take on water at about 10 gallons per minute. The Coast Guard was contacted and air dropped a pump to try to keep up with the flow which overwhelmed their small hand pump. That failed, and rather than risk another night on the boat, Shannon and Ron abandoned ship Tuesday afternoon. They took their credit cards and cash with them but their boat and its contents were uninsured (including Shannon's TS 440) and the boat has presumably sunk.

KARZ's Corner

Last month I wrote my column about the plight of Yevgeny Alimov, and your esponse was overwhelming. Several of the club members offered money and leads on equipment for Yevgeny as well

as translations to Russian. I sent him a letter about three weeks ago offering our help and asking him questions to better understand his customer requirements (please forgive my "Xerox speak"). I have not yet heard from him, but I understand that the mail is slow to the former Soviet Union these days. Hopefully we'll have a response in time to find him something at the RARA Hamfest.

Rag chewing with Russians can be a most enlightening experience. Three weeks ago I was tuning the lower part 15 meters looking to hone my CW skills (after all, Field Day is fast approaching and CW contacts do count double), when I heard UA1OSM calling CQ. He had a reasonably strong signal and a good fist, so I gave him a shout. His name is Serge and he's from Archangel. It turns out that we're about the same age and have kids the same age. Like with my family, his kids are also hams, but his wife is licensed as well.

His rig surprised me. He was running an ICOM 751 which is a relatively new rig (possibly part of a club station), but he had plans to purchase the old Drake twins (the R4 and T4) and asked for Hints and Kinks from QST. Since my collection goes back to '61, I promised him I'd see what I could find.

He also asked for an article on Murphy's law from the February '68 QST. Now, even though I have piles and piles of QST from the '60's, by Murphy's law ("If anything can go wrong, it will go wrong") you should all know that I would NOT have the Feb. '68 issue. Sure enough I didn't. However, I did learn quite a bit about the junk in my basement while validating Murphy's Maxim.

A plea to the net brought help the issue by Internal mail. Unfortunately I deleted the mail note saying who dug it up for me - Murphy strikes again - so whoever the good Samaritan was, please drop me another mail note so I can acknowledge your help.

Equipment loans

The following is a list of equipment located at the station in building 337 which is available for lending per the above guidelines. All other items are not to be removed from the station for personal use.
