

KARZ's Corner Winning Isn't Everything.....

Those of us who are old enough remember the Greenbay Packers of the late sixties fame and their legendary coach, Vince Lombardi. There was a lot to admire about the team. They had a dashing quarterback (Bart Star) and lots of great backs (whose names escape me), but most of all, they used to win and win and win. Their unofficial motto was Lombardi's favorite saying:

"Winning isn't everything......its the ONLY thing."

That was the only part of their persona I disliked. Sure, we all like to win, but to make winning the only measure of the team somehow seemed wrong. It seemed there should have been other factors considered such as sportsmanship, manners, and enjoyment of the game, but not according to Vince. Winning was the only yardstick for greatness.

Looking at amateur radio these days, I think I'm seeing more and more of Vince Lombardi in the competitive aspects of the hobby. A few weeks after the VHF contest I was deluged with mailings (all first class) complaining about the proposed changes in the roving rules and badmouthing some hams in New England who apparently made a bundle of points circling the grid squares and refusing to talk to other participants. I am not sure what the point of all this was (nor do I care). All I know is that there may be some people who think they can win contests by avoiding QSOs with others and that at least some other people seem so concerned about winning that they're willing to spend a pile of money to influence the likes of you and me to change the rules presumably so they can win.

We've all heard tales of Field Day operations where operators are timed with stop watches, and when their point generation rate drops below some target value, they are pulled and replaced just like a baseball pitcher in a big game. For me it brings up images of a trap door under the operator's chair. WOOSH.....he's outa there.

We've even had some squabbling within our own club. Now I want to make it VERY CLEAR that I am NOT taking sides on any of these disagreements. There are sound rational arguments for both sides of these discussions. I just want to point out that, to my mind, they come about due to an over emphasis on "winning" above everything else.

One thing I very much admire about the club's Field Day efforts is the balance we show year after year. Sure we're serious, and we turn in scores (usually top fifth to top tenth of our class) of which we can be proud. What we don't do is to get so carried away that we don't also have fun.

The Rochester Cup competition the past several years has (in my opinion) had a bit too much of the Lombardi win at all costs spirit, and I think we have to admit that we're as guilty as the next guys. This year, though, was like a breath of fresh air. May be it was confusion fostered by the new rules, or may be everyone in town was a bit "burned out", but this year didn't have the usual frantic urgency of past contests, not only for the XARC, but I believe for everyone else as well. This year, if you worked the contest, you did it to have fun.

We were fortunate this year, and in a close race we came out on top. Yes, I'm proud of our effort, and yes, I will be at the RVHG banquet next Saturday, but I'm also happy. I'm happy about the

way we and the other clubs participated. I can honestly say that for me this contest was the most fun. I am eagerly looking forward to next year's contest where I'd like it if the club were to win again. But win or loose, I'd like it even better to have a contest where we're all having fun enjoying the thrill of the competition. Winning is the only thing.....NOT!

March '94 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order on March 17 at 5:30PM in building 337 by president Sweet KF2QJ. Dave Attendance was 13 members and 1 quest. The treasurer reported a current balance of \$1194.15. A Xerox subsidy of about \$320 is expected soon. We were reminded that XARC receives \$2 from the ARRL if renewals are processed the club. To capture this opportunity, your completed ARRL renewal with check made out to XARC should be sent to treasurer Rick LaDonna, mail code 201-03L. He will complete processing of your ARRL renewal.

A 286 PC has been donated to replace the current 8088 PC in the club station. However, it needs more space than the 8088 and more space is not available. All repeaters remain up and operational.

Open BOD meetings have been scheduled at 11:30 in a 335 CR on Mondays prior to the club meeting. Discussions at the 3/14/94 meeting included replacement of the club HF vertical, emergency procedures, and budget allocations. There were no decisions made. Bob Karz has scheduled a meeting to discuss emergency procedures and equipment readiness in view of lessons learned form the California earthquake in January. This is an open meeting at 11:30am bldg. 335 room A.

The business meeting concluded at about 5:50 and was followed by several presentations focused on the January VHF contest. The presentations ended at 7:40. There were no action items.

- The N2EZS VHF contest station at Xerox Tower operated by Barry N2EZS, Ray WR2T, and Jim KB2UW.

- Results of our XARC win of the Rochester Cup. Our club awards went to Judy Stonehill N2KXS (top single op station), Warren Boudrie AA2LQ (most improved score), and Peter Fournia (worked most RVHFG members).

- Tim Stoffel NS9E, of the RVHFG reviewed the Rochester area VHF statistics during the contest. He also presented a professional quality video of the RVHFG June 1991 station at Ganett Hill.

- Jim Guentner KB2UW exhibited his home made Quad 440 array of 60 element.
